



This past year has provided us with several events that caused us to look deeply within our communities and ourselves. These events stirred us all and as a result, many in our community took action. These actions and the response from our community reinforced for me the strength of our LJCC. Whether our community members took action by choosing to say no to hate – from Charlotte to Charlottesville – or whose actions were to shower us with an outpouring of support for our friends, family, and fellow members of the human race in Houston, South Florida and the Caribbean islands devastated by Hurricanes. These actions are so much more than the acts of individuals in our community in response to these events. Each act, some as simple as coming to the J each day, provided thousands in our Charlotte community an opportunity to connect, share experiences, offer support, and deepen relationships. We know we will continue to face challenges in the days, months, and years ahead. We also know that we will face these challenges with renewed community strength. We know this because each event created an action, and each action was a reflection that each day brings an opportunity for us to **exercise our values**.

When Charlottesville stirred in us memories of the Holocaust, and we asked ourselves *“What would I have done if I had lived in Eastern Europe during the times of the Holocaust?”*; we made the choice to exercise our values by supporting the Butterfly Project.

When Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Maria pounded Houston, South Florida and the Caribbean islands, we exercised our values by donating our time, our money, and our support for all, as we know that our tradition teaches us that everyone is created equally, B’tzelem Elohim.

When Refugees and Immigrants were singled out, we learned about the challenges within our Charlotte refugee community and partnered with JCRI to exercise our values, because we remember that we too were once strangers in a strange land.

As members and donors to the Levine Jewish Community Center, I want to ensure that you know your generosity is having a positive impact on the operation of the J as we position ourselves to best serve the next generation.

Our new Outdoor Aquatics Complex opened on time for Memorial Day weekend and best of all, was on budget! This revitalized part of our facility opened to rave reviews and appreciation, offering an improvement over past years. To ensure that we met our pledge to you to ensure an enhanced level of service and safety throughout the summer, we brought on and maintained more staff this past summer.

In addition to the investments we continue to make to our facilities, your Board of Directors recently organized two Task Forces whose charge was to assess the climate for increased program offerings and organizational enhancements that would broaden Jewish Engagement amongst the members of our community as well as expand our program offerings for Adults. The Task Forces listened to our members through focus groups and collaborated with staff in our planning process for 2017-2019. Our Board Task Forces made some wonderful recommendations for areas of partnership and new initiatives to continue to

When we face the constant deluge of imagery, articles, and Social Media posts that address the challenges in our nation and our world, we are far too often overwhelmed. Rather than succumbing to the paralysis, or sitting and crying, or getting angry; we have a choice. 
### Did You Know...

We receive **30,000** member visits per month, with over **45,000** visits per month in the summer. These figures continue to grow from year to year.



*Andrew's personal reason for giving back: His son's teacher felt that he could benefit from a different type of learning style, which would come from private school, which obviously would cost money. He saw his son flourish from the school and the teaching style. He thought about how other children would also benefit from a private school setting. What if the family did not have the means to send their child to private school? This was his chance to help.*

## About the Charlotte Heptathlon

Charlotte has become one of the largest financial centers in the nation over the last two decades. Naturally, this leads to competitive attitudes among the Charlotte firms. In 2016, two industry leaders decided to channel this competitive spirit for good.

Inspired by similar competitions in other cities, Andrew Lindner, partner at Frontier Capital, and Trey Tune, partner and portfolio manager at Brown Advisory, started the Charlotte Heptathlon.

The Charlotte Heptathlon is an athletic fundraising competition that consists of teams of two who compete in a series of seven events that test speed, agility, strength and endurance. The competition is open to all men and women. Each team is required to raise a minimum of \$1000. All proceeds from the competition benefit the Children's Scholarship Fund-Charlotte.

Children's Scholarship Fund-Charlotte is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing educational options for children (grades K-8) from low-income families residing in Mecklenburg County. Since 1999, Children's Scholarship Fund-Charlotte has invested over \$8.5 million in approximately 6,500 scholarships for at-risk children in Mecklenburg County. The CSF's purpose is to fund partial tuition assistance to economically disadvantaged children so that they may attend participating partner independent schools, which most effectively address their academic, emotional, physical and/or spiritual needs.

## Freedom School

Shalom Park Freedom School (SPFS) is a six-week literacy and character building summer program for elementary children (called scholars) who most need but can least afford summer learning opportunities. The first Jewish-sponsored Freedom School in the nation, SPFS is a collaboration among eight Jewish agencies on the Shalom Park campus. The program began in 2011 and includes 80 scholars from Huntingtowne Farms and Sterling Elementary, the two schools in faith-based partnerships with Temple Israel and Temple Beth El.

In addition to working on their reading each day, scholars participate in enrichment activities. One of those – and often a favorite – is swimming lessons provided by the LJCC each week. Each scholar wears a new swimsuit and brings a new towel, which have been donated through the LJCC Cares swimsuit drive held each spring.


**"We are thrilled to be able to enhance the Freedom School experience with these programs."**

*The JSTAGE and Camp Mindy Performing Arts Camp has hosted the Freedom School kids for several drama and dance workshops over the past three summers. The students enjoy theatre games, improvisation, using their bodies and voices to create a character and learning choreography to their favorite songs. Many of these kids do not get any drama or dance opportunities during the year and they really thrive in this creative and less structured atmosphere where they can express themselves in a different way. Involvement in the arts boosts self-confidence, communication skills, relieves stress and creates memories and friendships that last a lifetime.*

If you would have asked me 2 years ago if I would consider myself a "boxer," the answer would be "No way!" I had no interest in watching it and certainly not doing it!

But that all changed when I was introduced to the Levine JCC's personal trainer Suzanne DiOrio. Suzanne introduced me to boxing and all the benefits that came along with it. I have Parkinson's disease and research shows it is very beneficial to box both physically and mentally. When I box, I only think about boxing and my tremors decrease and my balance is better.



As I tell my experience to others, more and more members are now boxing at the J! I am so grateful and appreciative to the J and to my personal trainers. The staff here continue to find ways to improve the health and wellness of their members. They have seen the benefits of boxing and plan to launch Rock Steady Boxing later this year. Rock Steady Boxing gives people with Parkinson's disease hope by improving their quality of life through a non-contact boxing based fitness curriculum. I can't wait to be the first to sign up!
